The June painting party will feature "Family Meals" portion of the Fair Theme of "Big Wheels, Pig Squeals and Family Meals".


You will create and take home a 10 x 20 painting - created using a template with step by step instructions with Flory Phillips.

Recipe for Mexican Tortilla Soup

- 1T olive oil 1 white onion, diced 1/2 red onion, diced 1 green bell pepper, diced 2T pickled jalapenos, diced 2T lime juice 2t taco seasoning 4 cups chicken stock
- 2 400 gram cans diced tomatoes1 small can corn, drained2 cans black beans2T tomato paste1 cup shredded cooked chicken salt and pepper to taste
- Saute over medium-high heat with olive oil onions, bell pepper, jalapenos, lime juice and taco seasoning until onions are soft.
- Reduce heat to medium and add chicken stock, tomatoes, corn, black beans, tomato paste and chicken. Stir well and simmer on medium heat 40-45 minutes.
- Serve with Shredded cheese, sour cream, tortilla chips and fresh chopped cilantro. Makes about 5-7 servings Submitted by Joanie Botts


Fun and Games Night - May 31st
