## WHAT IS THE 4-H LIVESTOCK AUCTION?

The Jackson County 4-H Livestock Auction entitles a business, organization or individual to purchase an animal from a 4-Her(s).

## WHO BENEFITS FROM THE AUCTION?

The proceeds go directly to the 4-H member. Many 4-Her's use the proceeds from the auction to fund next year's livestock project or to help pay to further their education. When the 4-Her is able to continue in this project, it provides the livestock at our county fair that so many people enjoy viewing.

As a buyer, you will receive one picture of the 4-H member with the animal to display. Your name will be placed on a sign outside of the show arena and listed in next year's Jackson County Fair Book. Buyers will also be listed in next year's publicity and promotional materials.

## HOW DOES THE AUCTION WORK?

If you attend the auction, or send a representative to the auction, and are planning on purchasing an animal, you need to fill out a buyer's card before the start of the auction. You will be asked to fill in the buyer's name, contact person, address, email, and phone number. If you are buying in a group, please fill out one card for the group. You will be given a list of all the 4-Hers selling animals, their parents' names, the weight of the animal, and the total guaranteed price. When the auction commences, you will place a bid by raising your hand, nodding or even winking to one of the volunteer ring men!

You will bid a total price for the animal. If you send the animal to market, you will pay the amount over the appraised price.

The appraised markets: Beef & Dairy Beef—United Producers; Sheep & Boer Goats—Brewer Livestock; Swine—Pavey Stockyards

If the animal is going to a locker (non-appraised market), or you are taking the animal home, then you will pay the total sale price.

For example, if you bid \$400 on an animal that has an appraised price of \$120 and want to send it to market, you would pay \$280 (difference). However, if you want the animal sent to a locker or wish to take it home, you would pay \$400.

When the volunteer auctioneer says "SOLD!" the animal is yours. When you want to leave the auction, you need to see the settling clerk and pay for the animal or animals at that time or make other arrangements.

## IS THE BUYER RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REMOVAL OF THE PURCHASED ANIMAL FROM THE FAIR GROUNDS?

If the animal is to go to one of the appraised markets, the livestock committee makes sure the animal gets shipped to the right market. If you, the buyer, want the animal sent to one of the local locker plants, arrangements need to be made prior to the sale with the locker. The locker plants are:

**Brownstown Frozen Foods:** 812-358-4978 and **Jackson County Custom Processing:** 812-522-1705

The livestock committee will make sure the animal gets loaded on the appropriate trailer. If you plan to use a different locker, you will need to provide your own transportation.
