Balance	The foot is carried in a straight line, without deviation, during the stride.
Suspension	An expression used when a horse's motion seems excessively difficult to perform.
Phase	The time used to take one stride.
Diagonal Gait	The ability of the horse to control his action in order to travel in a collected manner and in correct form.
True-Moving	
Easy Gaited	An expression used when the horse's gaits are executed in a smooth, collected manner, and the action is not labored or excessive.
Stride	A reference to a four-beat lateral gait that is very smooth and easy to ride.
Free Moving	The characteristic style in which the horse lifts his front and hind feet
Regularity	high; it is the action or the animation achieved when a horse folds his knees and holds the forearm momentarily horizontal and flexes the hock noticeably.
Labored	The movement of a foot from one spot to the next.
Rapidity	The distance between successive imprints of the same foot. Also called
Step	length of stride.
Swing Phase	The period of time that a foot (or feet) is (are) moving through the air.
Lateral Gait	One in which the legs/feet on the same side of the body move as a pair or sequence.
