### Eastern Hellbender Salamander

The Eastern Hellbender Salamander is a giant salamander that is native to the Eastern and Central parts of the United States. It is known for being the largest salamander in all of North America. The population of the hellbender has declined significantly since the 1980's, however it has been recorded that the population has been declining since 1957. The population decline has been said to have been caused by water quality issues. In the state of Indiana, the hellbender only remains in Blue River. Scientists in partnership with other organizations have been working to improve our water. In October of 2019, two low-head dams in Indian Creek in Corydon, Indiana. The removal of the dams has helped to clear sediment from the water and reconnect Blue River which leads into the Ohio River. This is a perfect time for hellbender augmentation. Purdue Forestry and Natural Resource's "Help the Hellbender" crew released 41 of their adult hellbenders raised in captivity into the Blue River on July 20th. This release is the first of several scheduled for this summer. Purdue rearing lab and over 12 years worth of their lab's work has been featured in a new documentary, "Hellbender in the Blue". The film is available for purchase or can be streamed trough Vimeo on Demand.

## August Garden Calendar

<u>Lawns, Woody Ornamentals, and Fruits</u> Check Trees and shrubs that have been planted in recent years for girdling damage by guy wires, burlap, or twine.

Don't fertilize woody plants now. It stimulates late growth that will not have time to harden off properly before winter.

Hand-prune and destroy bagworms, fall webworms and tent caterpillars.

Pears are best ripened off the tree, so do not wait for the fruit to turn yellowish on the tree. Harvest pears when color of fruit changes – usually from a dark green to a lighter green – and when the fruit is easily twisted and removed from the spur.

Prune out and destroy the raspberry and blackberry canes that bore fruits this year. They will not produce fruit again next year, but they may harbor insect and disease organisms.

If the weather turns dry, keep newly established plants well-watered. New plants should receive 1-1.5 inches of water every 7 to 10 days.

Begin seeding new lawns or bare spots in established lawns from mid-August through mid-September.

## August Garden Calendar Continued

Indoor Plants And Activities

Bring in cuttings from annual garden plants such as impatiens, coleus, geraniums, and wax begonias to overwinter indoors. Root the cuttings in peat moss, potting soil, perlite, or moist vermiculites instead of water.



Order spring flowering bulbs for fall planting

Cut flowers rom garden to bring a little color indoors, or dry for everlasting arrangements.

<u>Flowers, Vegetables, and Small Fruits</u> Keep the garden well-watered during dry weather and free of weeds, insects and disease.

Complete fall garden planting by direct-seeding carrots, beets, kohlrabi, kale and snap beans early this month. Lettuce, spinach, radishes and green onions can be planted later in August and early September. Don't forget to thin seedlings to appropriate spacing as needed.



Harvest onions after the tops yellow and fall, then cure them in a warm, dry, well-ventilated area. The necks should be free of moisture when fully cured in about a week's time.

Harvest potatoes after the tops yellow and die. Potatoes also need to be cured before storage.

Pick beans, tomatoes, peppers and squash often to encourage further production.

Harvest watermelon when several factors indicate ripeness: the underside ground spot turns from whitish to creamy yellow; the tendril closest to the melon turns brown and shrivels; the rind loses its gloss and appears dull; and the melon produces a dull thud, rather than a ringing sound when thumped.

Harvest sweet corn when kernels are plump and ooze a milky juice when punctured with your fingernail. If the liquid is watery, you're too early; if the kernels are doughy, you're too late.

Keep faded flowers pinched off bedding plants to promote further flowering and improve plant appearance.

### ServSafe Food Handler Certification

If you sell food to an end consumer in the state of Indiana, you are either identified as a Retail Food Establishment or a Home-Based Vendor. Individuals who sell goods at farmers' market or roadside stands are operating under home-based vendors laws. Indiana recently passed a new law (HB 1149) which includes changes that will impact all person's operating as a home-based vendor.

All home-based vendors must obtain a food handler certificate from a certificate issuer that is accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI). Our office will be offering ongoing ServSafe Food Handler training the next few months. This training fulfills the new requirement under the HB 1149 law and is valid for three years.

Training with be held on August 29 from 9am-1pm at the Jennings Extension office. The training cost is \$40. You can register online or contact our office for assistance. See enlcosed flyer for more information about the training. More information can be found at: https://bit.ly/Home-BasedVendors

- 1. Let's Move! Jennings has been a big success! The 8-week walking program was created by Joining Jennings for Healthy Living and started the week after the Jennings County Fair. Each week, there are walks at a local park/recreation area, in downtown North Vernon, and to different townships in the county. We've had a high of 32 people at one walk and our final walk will finish on Saturday, August 13th at the Hayden Historical Museum. We'll have a wrap up event starting at 9:30am at the museum, come join us!
- 2. The Boys & Girls Club of Jennings County's Education Garden has been producing for several weeks now and the kids seem to love the chance to garden and enjoy the fruits of their labor so to speak! Thanks to everyone who helped get that project started!
- 3. Dr. Jennifer Stanley started a walking group at the end of last year each meetup starts with a brief discussion of health and everyone walks for about 45 minutes. ### Home Food Preservation

Gardens are starting to produce and you might be looking for ways to preserve all of it. A couple of things to keep in mind:

- 1. Have you had your pressure canner tested this year? Yearly testing is recommended so you do not under-process. Our office offers gauge testing for \$5.00 per gauge.
- 2. Are you using tested recipes? If not, we can lead you in the direction of resources to use. One is the "So Easy To Preserve" cookbook or the Complete Guide to Home Canning; both are available from our office.

## Peach Jam (makes about 8 half pint jars)

2 quarts crushed, peeled peaches 1/2 cup water 6 cups sugar

Sterilize canning jars. combine peaches and water; cook gently 10 minute. Add sugar; slowly bring to boil, stirring occasionally until sugar dissolves. Cook rapidly until thick, about 15 minutes; stir frequently to prevent sticking. Pour hot jams into hot jars, leaving 1/4 inch headspace. Wipe jar rims and adjust lids. Process 5 minutes. in a Boiling Water Bath.

NOTE: For Spiced Peach Jam, tie the following ingredients in cheesecloth and add to the jam during cooking. Remove spice bag before pouring hot jam into hot jars. Process as directed for peach jam.

1 teasoon whole cloves

1/2 teaspoon whole allspice

1 stick cinnamon (3 inch piece)

# ServSafe Food Handler Certificate of Achievement

The ServSafe Food Handler course is for anyone who needs basic food safety and food handling training, including home-based vendors, food service workers, volunteers, or others who work with food who only need the basic training. *This course is NOT intended for foodservice managers.* To obtain your foodservice manager certification, you must take the ServSafe Food Protection Manager course and exam. ServSafe Food Handler satisfies training requirements for HBVs outlined in Indiana House Bill 1149. This program focuses on key aspects including basic food safety, personal hygiene, cross-contamination and allergens, time and temperature, and cleaning and sanitation.

The half-day training includes a booklet and assessment. The Certificate of Achievement is valid for three years. A photo ID with signature is required to take the assessment (driver license, state ID, student ID, military ID, employee ID, U.S. green card, or valid passport).

The ServSafe Food Handler training fulfills the food safety training requirements mandated for home-based vendors in the state of Indiana. After passing the assessment, your Food Handler Certificate of Achievement will be documented with the National Restaurant Association so that you have easy access at any time to look up and prove your training.

## ServSafe Food Handler Certificate Training and Assessment


