PREMIUM MONEY AND 4-H AWARDS

1) Explanation of 4-H Ribbons:

<u>Grand Champion</u> – BEST exhibit in the entire project or division/level. (*Selected from the Champions of that project).

<u>Reserve Grand Champion</u> – 2nd BEST exhibit in the entire project or division/level. (*Selected from Champion exhibits and the Reserve Champion of the division that won Grand Champion).

<u>Champion</u> – Best exhibit in each division (*Selected from the Honor exhibits).

<u>Reserve Champion</u> – 2nd best exhibit in each division (*Selected from the Honor exhibits).

<u>Honor Group</u> – 1st place with special recognition (*Selected from Blue exhibits).

Blue – 1st place (meets all project requirements).

Red - 2nd place

White - 3rd place

Green - participation

**There is no limit on the number of honor, blue, red or white ribbons a judge may award.

2) Champions and State Fair placings

a. These will be selected in <u>private</u> from the Honor group exhibits and announced when the fair opens. If selected for State Fair you will receive additional information about entry at that level.

2) Premium money

- a. \$5.00/completed project category. For example: a 4-H member will be paid ONE time for the beef project, not by the number of beef animals shown.
- b. Money can ONLY be picked up on Fri., July 20 from 1-3 p.m. and Sat., July 21 from 1-3 p.m.
- c. Money that is not picked up at these times will NOT be given out later.
- d. Money pick up process starts in Scott Hall (kitchen area).
- e. Livestock members will not be paid until they turn in a clean pen card signed by the Dept. superintendent or their barn has been released as a whole.

3) Awards program

- a. Saturday, July 21st, Indoor Arena.
- b. Sponsors provide awards for Scott and Magill Hall projects. The number of awards vary from project to project—some are 1 and others are 1/division.

c. Postcards will be sent out to those who are receiving awards so you can attend.

4) State Fair Exhibits

- a. Only certain projects have State Fair exhibits—see page 28 of the handbook for a list of those projects.
- b. 4-H member is responsible for getting their own project to the State Fair.
- c. Detailed instructions will be given out on project release day.
- d. 4-H garden and single vegetable—anyone can exhibit at St. Fair.
- e. Livestock—Beef, sheep and swine entries must be made by June 1. All other animals—July 1.

5) 4-H Completion

- a. 4-H year pin if they complete the following requirements:
 - a. Exhibit at fair
 - b. Turn in completed record sheet
- b. The pins will be given to your 4-H leader and they will pass them out to you in the Fall/Winter months.
- c. Staying in 4-H for all 10 years will receive a special award and recognition at the fair.
