We are quickly approaching the 2021 Johnson County Fair. We look forward to seeing you show your horse and the skills you have practiced. In order to help us prepare, we need you to submit your project entries and your record sheets prior to the fair. Entries will be done in the FairEntry system, which we have utilized the last couple of years.

You may enter as many horses at the fair as you have enrolled (mare and foal count as one). Complete separate class entries for each horse you plan to exhibit. Classes may be scratched but not added after submission of these entries!

The following page is the horse stall request form, it must be completed and returned to the Extension Office by July 1st!


Completed entries via <http://johnsoncountyindiana.fairentry.com/> must be completed in the online system by July 1st. If the fair animal entry is not received by the deadline you will not be eligible to show animals!

Completed record sheets for ALL PROJECTS must be submitted by Google Form into the Extension Office on or before July 1st. If FairEntry is not completed and record sheet(s) are not received by the deadline you will not be eligible to show animals!

IMPORTANT NOTE FROM HORSE & PONY SUPERINTENDANT:

ALL exhibitors showing at the Johnson County 4-H Horse & Pony show will be required to stall one animal, subject to the capacity of the stall barns.

As everyone is aware, each member participating at the county fair is required to have at least one enrolled horse or pony stalled from Sunday, July 18 through the release time on July 22. Due to the fact that we have more members than stalls, we sometimes have to ask members to haul their horses in and out of the fairgrounds for each show they are participating in.

We do our best to accommodate everyone’s requests and needs, but it becomes rather challenging with only 84 stalls. If you would prefer not to have a stall, please check the appropriate box below (this does not guarantee you will not have to stall your horse as required-it means if we need additional stalls, you will be on the list of those allowed to haul your animal in and out of the fairgrounds as needed).

We will post stall assignments via the Horse and Pony website and/or email in a timely manner so you can make plans as needed before the fair. Please do not assume you will have a stall or you will have the number of stalls requested. Make sure to check the stall assignments for confirmation.

If you prefer to be stalled next to someone, please make a note in the space provided below. Once again, we try our best to accommodate everyone’s requests, but they cannot be guaranteed. Once stall assignments are posted, they will not be changed.
