**\*NEW for 2022\*** Livestock from the Knox County Fair will be released on Saturday, July 23 between 4:00 am to Noon.

“All animal/s (except horse & pony) must stay in their area/pen/cage until approval is given by an Extension Educator before they are release from the fair. Failure to comply, the 4-H'er will forfeits any 4-H premium money, 4-H auction money, all auction privileges for that year, and will not be allowed to show that specie/s the following year.”

### **Tips for a Successful Project**

- Read your project manual carefully for detailed instructions on exhibit preparation.
- If differences exists between the manual and the handbook, always follow the handbook.
- Remember, exhibits not completed according to the project rules will be judged on their own merit and will be dropped one ribbon placing.
- Remember, the poster is to be horizontal with the 28 inch side on the top. Posters not displayed horizontally will be dropped one ribbon placing as well.
- All posters must be no heavier than a foam board and covered with plastic prior to judging.
- No changes will be made after the judge has left.

### **Record Sheets**

Your White and/or Green Records Sheets are due during check-in times for you to receive your Fair Pass. Please call if you have questions about filling out your record sheet.

### **4-H Manuals:**

Only 4-H Manuals that need to be turned into Extension Office before July 16 are **Dog, Poultry, Rabbit, and Horse & Pony manuals.**

Please complete 3 activities in the manual. They do not have to be signed by a leader.

### **Photography**

### **Livestock Check-in**

Livestock check-in for Beef, Dairy, Goats, Llama/Alpaca, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep and Swine is between 4:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

All Livestock must be Checked-in by 10:00 pm on Sunday, July 17 to show!!

### **Bedding**

- 2022 bedding fees:
  - poultry (1-9 birds)-\$5;
  - poultry (over 9 birds)-\$10.
- Beef & Dairy: provided
- Sheep & goats: provide your own.
- Swine: provide your own. WOOD SHAVINGS ONLY.

Bedding fees are to be paid at the Extension Office when you turn in your green livestock record books.

### **YQCA CERTIFICATES**

Youth exhibiting Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep & Swine are required to complete YQCA training.

If you have completed online, please send a copy of your certificate to the Extension Office ASAP. If it is not completed you will not be able to show!

### **Registered Animals**

If showing registered animal "Goat, Swine, or Beef", the superintendents MUST check papers.

### **Swine Information**

Correct ear notches on ALL hogs MUST match swine enrollment form. If they do not match hogs cannot be unloaded & will not be allowed to show.

Questionable ear notches will be subject to review by screening committee; animal may be disqualified if the committee feels ear notches are fresh.

### **Remove old ear tags before weigh-in.**

Please note **weight requirements:**

- Barrows: 220-300 lbs.
- Crossbred gilts: at least 200 lbs., no upper limit
- Purebred gilts with papers: no less than 180 lbs., no upper limit.

Body shaving PROHIBITED!! Shaved animals will not be allowed to exhibit. Animals must have at least one-half (1/2) inch of hair.

### **FANS IN BARN**

Only fans approved by superintendents will be allowed in ALL barns. Please make sure your fan is pointed in the same direction as everyone else in the barn. This will help with air circulation.

Rabbits are not allowed to have personal fans in the Rabbit Barn.

### **Knox County Livestock Grooming Rule**

The Knox County 4-H Council has adopted a new Livestock Grooming Assistance polices:

“All species: Grooming must be done within 100 feet of respective barn or in case of horses, from horse show arena.

4-H animal exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance only from an immediate family member including, father, mother, step-father/mother, legal guardian, brother, sister, step-brother/sister, grandfather/mother, aunt, uncle, aunt’s/uncle’s children, from a current 4-H member, and/or from individual enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance Program.”

It is the intent that the 4-H member take responsibility for caring for and grooming his/her own animals. However, it is recognized that all youth need assistance. The purpose of this program is to provide an avenue for equal access to qualified animal grooming assistance. Those enrolled in this program should not see this as a way to do the work for the 4-H member, but should provide hands-on learning opportunities that further the skills and abilities of the 4-H member.

### **Beef -**

Moving cattle from barn to tie-outs MUST take place between 9:00 and 9:30 p.m. Cattle must be back in the barn by 10:00 a.m.

**\*NEW\*** Beef Superintendents will assign grooming area for beef cattle during the Knox County Fair.

### **Rabbits**

Rabbit show will start at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, July 18th. Please take all rabbit carriers home after the rabbit show. All showmanship will be judged Monday after the show.

### **Mentor Showmanship Class**

Again, this year we will have a mentor showmanship class for Mini 4-H & 4-H members who do not own that species of animal. This is for 4-H members ONLY. Mentor showman will use another 4-H member’s animal to show. Mini 4-H members showing animals over 300 lbs. must have the animals owner in control at all times.

### **MAKE-UP RING**

Please make every effort to keep the make-up ring cluster free. Only the next class of animals should be in the make-up ring. This is not the place for you to tie up your animals for the entire show.

### **Behavior Code**

**All EXHIBITORS, PARENTS, and SPECTATORS** will conduct themselves as ladies and gentlemen. They are to conduct themselves in such a way as to set a good example for other 4-H exhibitors and spectators at the show. IMPOLITE BEHAVIOR, POOR SPORTSMANSHIP, OR DISRUPTIVE ACTIONS (as deemed by the show management) will result in disqualification and/or removal from the fairgrounds.

### **Dress Code**

Appropriate dress must be worn by all livestock 4-H exhibitors during shows, auction, and pictures. This includes NO halter-tops, bare midriffs, shorts, or t-shirts with inappropriate language. If not dressed appropriately a t-shirt will be provided to you. This will be the superintendent's decision.

### **Auction Information**

A 5% administration fee will be deducted from each 4-H member going through the auction.

Pens not cleaned after the auction will result in auction money being withheld.

Any animal going through the Knox County auction will not be allowed to show at the Indiana State Fair.

**You have to identify which animal you are taking through the auction by noon on Thursday, July 21!**

### **Auction Pictures**

We would like for each 4-H member who will be going through the 4-H Auction on Thursday, July 21 to provide a **4 x 4 inch picture** of themselves with the species of livestock they will be selling in the auction. Please note it does not need to be the specific animal you will be auctioning that evening, just one of the same species. The name of the 4-H member needs to be printed on the back of the picture. We **must** have the picture by Thursday, July 21st.

This applies to Beef, Dairy, Goats, Llama/ Alpaca, Sheep, and Swine. Those who show Poultry, Rabbits and Horses need not worry about providing a picture.

### Cat Show

The cat show will be held in the VU Pavilion on Wednesday, July 20th at 3:00 p.m.

### Dog & Cat Vaccinations

All 4-H members exhibiting a dog or a cat at the 2022 Knox County Fair must have a valid Certificate of Vaccination.

The form is required by the Indiana Board of Animal Health. Forms are available in the Extension Office or on the Indiana 4-H website under projects dogs and cats:

## **Car & Golf Cart/Side-by-Side Policy**

- Permits will be available at the office at \$40.00 for Car and \$20.00 for Golf Cart / Side-by-Side each and a list of guidelines will be given to owners.
- All vehicles must register, show proof of insurance and have a visible permit.
- Riders that are 17 and under on ATV, Side-by-Sides, & Dirt Bikes are required by Indiana Law to wear an approved helmet on public and private land.
- Passenger number should not exceed seating capacity.
- All drivers should be licensed!
- After 4:00 p.m. no vehicles should be driven on the grounds except for fair officials and handicap use.
- The fair board is not responsible for injuries or damaged vehicles.
- Any vehicle caught abusing these guidelines is subject to removal from grounds.

## **Parking/Driving Rules will be enforced during the Knox County Fair!**

**Please read below for more details:**

During the 2022 Knox County Fair all vehicles who will use the road around the fairgrounds will enter the fairgrounds on the west-side (Vincennes side). The east-side (Bicknell side) will be closed after 4:00 pm each day of the fair. There will be one-way traffic around the loop of the fairgrounds going west toward Vincennes, making it safer for fairgoers.

For those 4-H Families who need to drive up to the barns to feed/water their animals after 4:00 p.m., you must use the west-side entrance and drive down the first isle to use the specified gate. This gate will be located in between the rabbit and poultry barns. **YOU MUST HAVE A CAR PASS IN ORDER TO GET INTO THE FAIRGROUNDS WITH A VEHICLE.**

This pass will allow one person into the grounds. Any other people in the vehicle must show their 4-H pass or pay to get in. **THIS WILL BE ENFORCED!**

Car passes may be purchased at the Fair Office.

**Parking is prohibited along the rabbit and poultry barn or across the road from the rabbit and poultry barn along the fence. Violators will be towed.**

## Overnight Stays @ The Fair



Purdue University set a policy for no overnight stays at the fairgrounds during the 4-H fairs. The Knox County 4-H Council has adopted this policy. Effective January 1st, 1998 there will be no 4-H liability or health insurance coverage provided to youth during overnight stays at the fair. The Knox County Fair Board has adopted a policy that all youth must be accompanied by a parent or guardian or an adult signing they are responsible for the youth's activities, in order to spend the night at the fair. Forms are available at the Fair Office for overnight stays.
