44-H 4 Challenge

Registration and submission for the challenges will take place through 4-H Online. There is no charge to participate! We hope you will join the 4-H 4 Challenge!




4-H ROAD SHOW




It is very important that you keep your information in 4HOnline as upto-date as possible. We receive returned mail daily due to "Forward Expired" "Return to Sender" "Unable to Forward", etc. If you think you should be receiving information in

the mail, please take a minute to confirm that your mailing address is correct.

We have also noticed that the system seems to be changing how many years you were involved with a project, so while you are checking your address, be sure to check the project years, too!

And please remember, the address for 4HOnline is **v2.4honline.com**. DO NOT go to the old address, and DO NOT forget the V2 part, which stands for Version 2.



Safety Plan Guidelines



Until further notice...We ask that the following becomes a regular for all 4-H Events as we continue to maneuver through the world with Covid restrictions.

Pack a face covering: Face covering will need to be worn at ALL 4-H Events (indoors and outdoors) when 6' social distancing cannot be maintained.

Do a Self-Check of your Health: If you or a member of your household are feeling ill or have been in contact with an ill individual, or awaiting test results, please to not come.

Refreshments: Refreshments can be store bought or homemade, but must be individually bagged for distribution.

Recreation: Youth should not be sharing materials or game equipment. If sharing something, remind youth to not touch their face before using hand sanitizer or washing their hands with soap and water.
