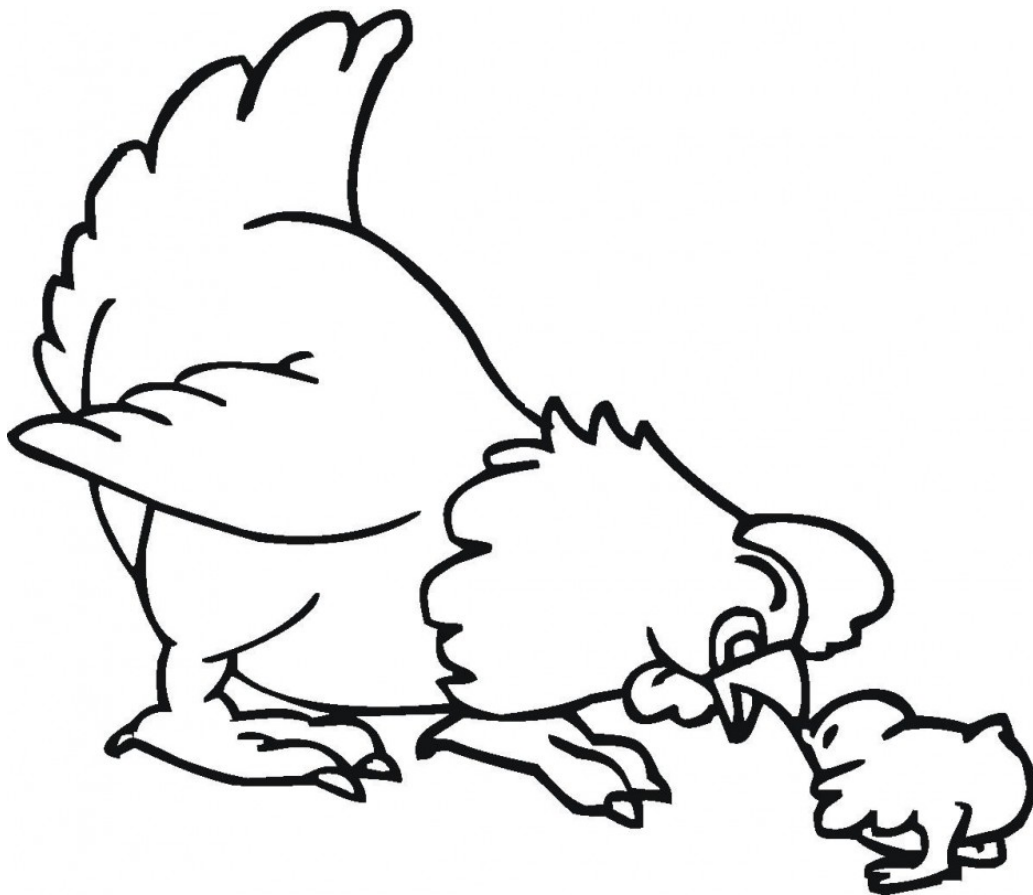

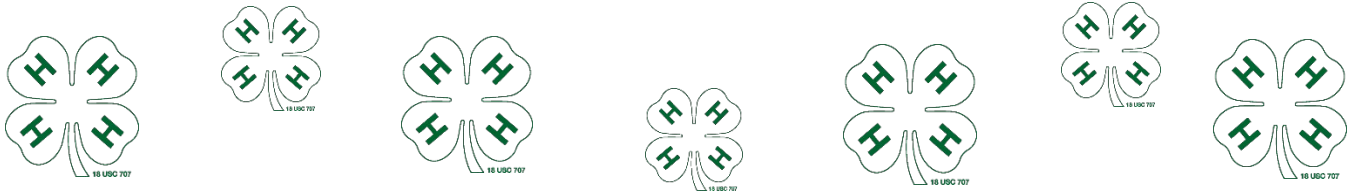
MINI 4-H MEMBER'S PAGE

POULTRY FACTS

According to the American Poultry Association, the term “poultry” includes chickens, geese, ducks, Guinea fowl, and turkeys.

Poultry--Domestic fowl, particularly those raised for food or laying eggs.

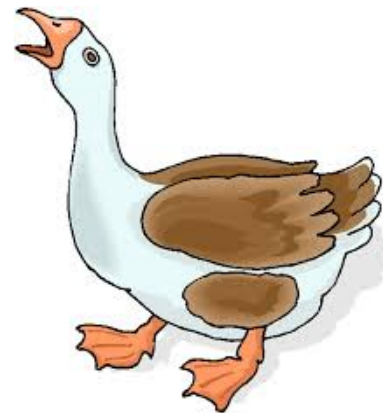
Fowl--A bird, such as a duck, goose, turkey, or pheasant that can be used as food or hunted as game.

According to Michigan State University Extension, egg color is determined by the genetics of the hens. The breed of the hen will indicate what color eggs she will produce. For example, Leghorn chickens lay white eggs while Orpingtons lay brown eggs and Ameraucana produce blue eggs.

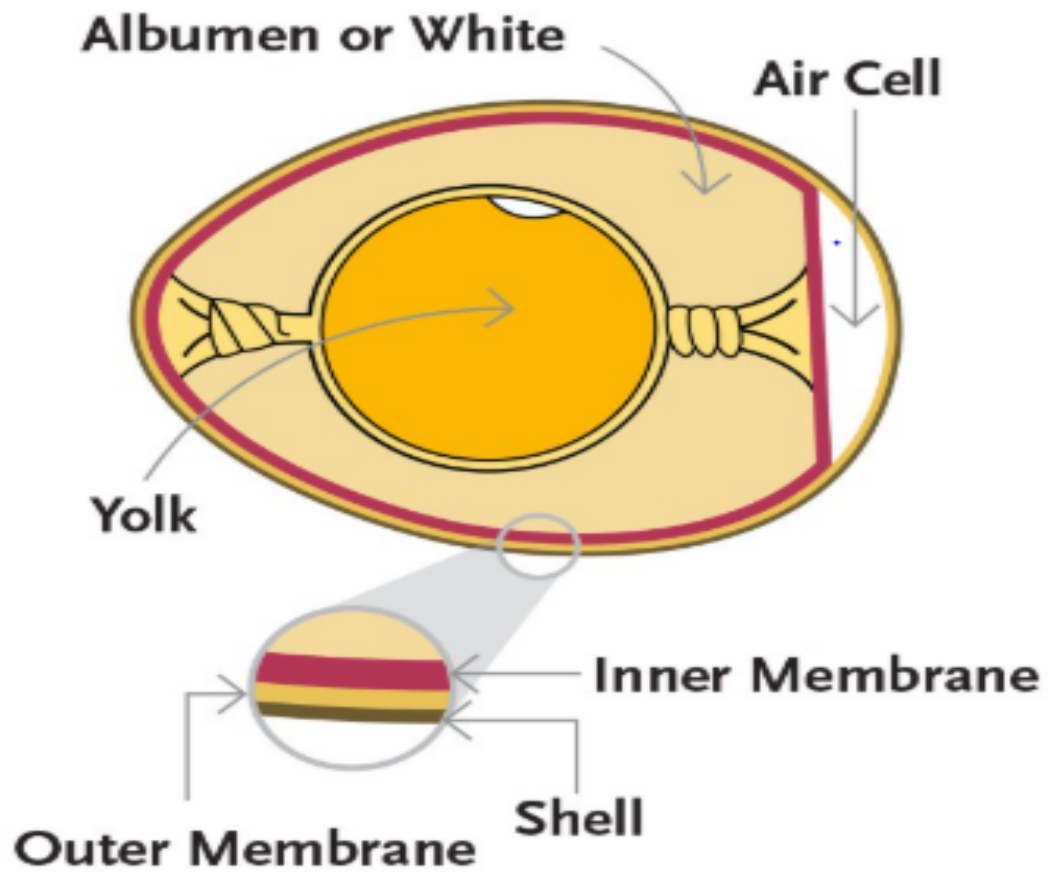
Domestication of the chicken dates back to at least 2000 B.C., according to Penn State Extension.

Examples of Poultry and Fowl that can be exhibited in a 4-H project:

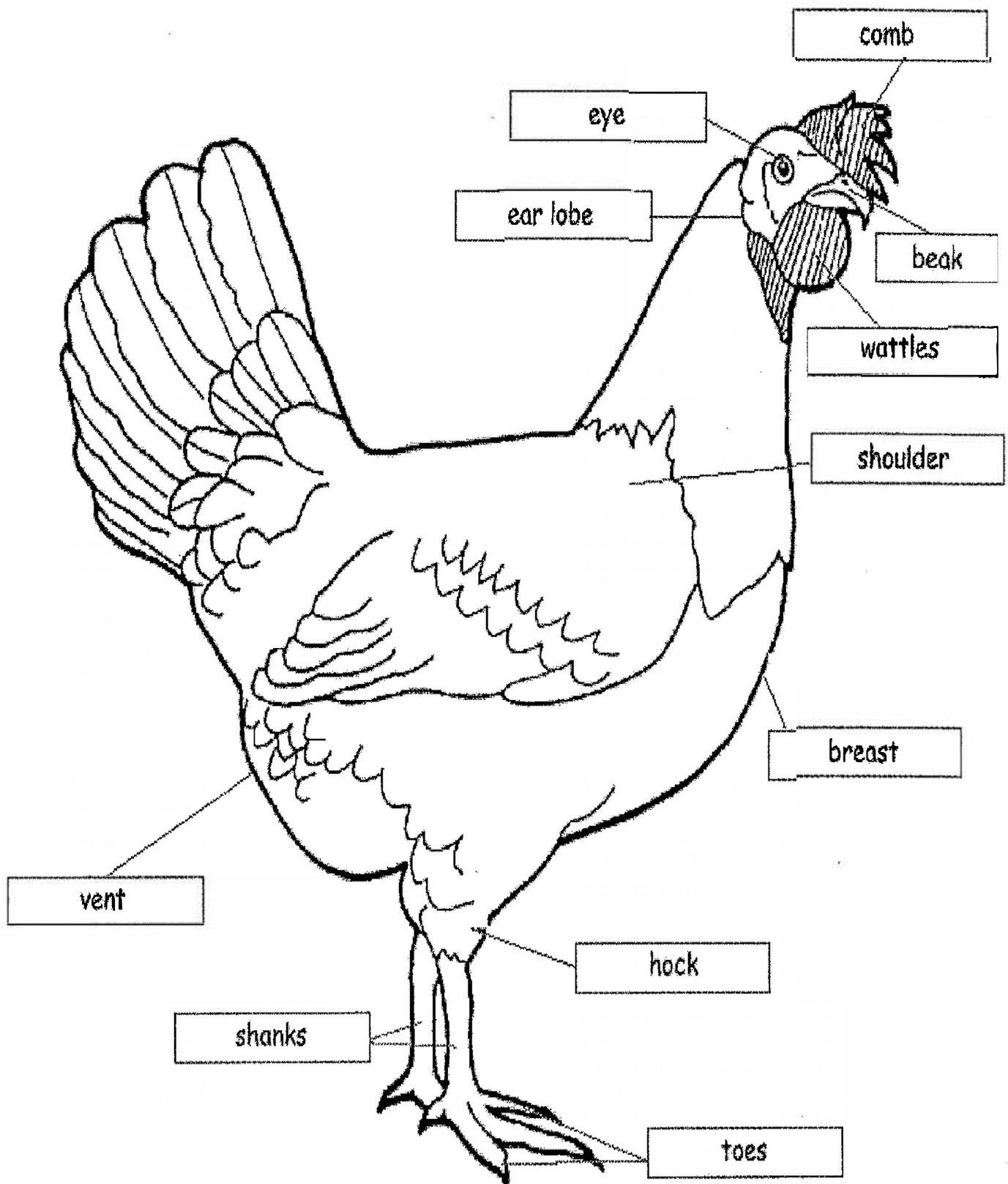
- Chickens--White Rock, White Leghorns, Barred Plymouth Rock, New Hampshire Reds, and Rhode Island Reds etc.
- Waterfowl--Ducks, Geese
- Pigeons--Fancy, sporting, and utility breeds.
- Turkeys-- Red Bourbon, Bronze-Breasted, and White Giant etc.
- Guineas--Purple, lavender, coral blue, white, buff, and Pearl etc.

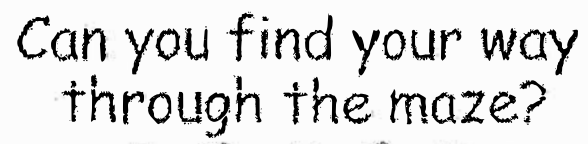


PARTS OF AN EGG

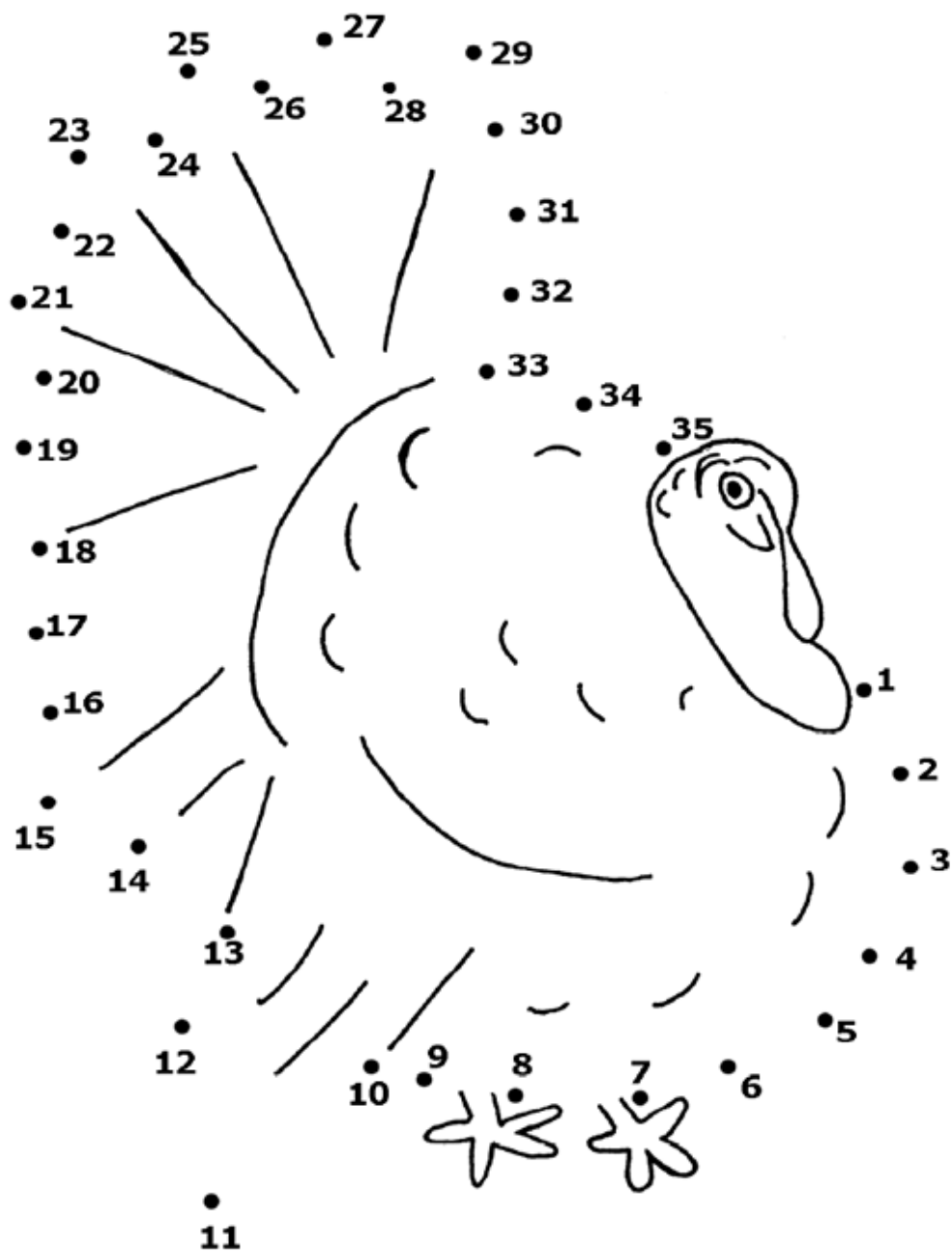


Parts of a Chicken

Supplies:

Construction Paper

Paper Plate

Yellow & Orange Craft Paint or Watercolor

1 Googly Eye

Directions:

1-Cut out a circle for the head and feet on construction paper

2-Paint paper plate yellow

3-Paint head & legs yellow & orange

4-Fold paper plate in half

5-Place legs in opening and staple closed

6-Glue head on & googly eye

Exhibit Requirements

Your project or poster will be exhibited at the Lawrence County 4-H Fair and placed in a special Mini 4-H section.

- All posters must be displayed horizontally and must be mounted on a stiff backing, covered in plastic or a plastic sleeve (foam board and plastic sleeves are available to buy at the Extension Office). Poster board alone is not acceptable. Instructions are on the next page.
- All exhibits must have a 2-inch by 4-inch label attached in the bottom right corner. It should list your name and your club name. If you made a poster, please make sure this label is under the plastic cover.
- The dates and times for brining your non-animal projects will be posted online and in the 4-H newsletter.
- The judge may make suggestions about your exhibit, but there will be no placement judging or competition between mini 4-H members in the show arena. This includes ALL animal shows.
- Special Mini 4-H ribbons will be given to everyone who exhibits a project.
- You may show another 4-H member's animal at the fair, or bring your own the day of show. You may show only one animal. You must be able to handle the animal.
- *If you are showing any animal other than cat or dog, an adult must be in the arena with you at all times. If you are showing a horse, a parent must assist you in the ring.*
- Mini projects cannot exhibit at the State Fair.

What to Exhibit:

Exhibit one of the following:

1. One bird
2. Exhibit a 28" x 22" poster or a 3-5 page scrapbook (8-1/2" x 11 "), or a small scale model, telling the story of an animal that you own and/or care for. Photographs may be used. Include a one line title for each picture.
 - a) All poster projects must be displayed horizontally and must be mounted on a stiff backing (foam boards are available for purchase in the Extension Office). Poster board alone is not acceptable. You must also label your poster in the lower right hand corner with a 2" x 4" label that you make yourself.
 - b) Scrapbook pages should be 8-1/2" x 11" and should be attached in a folder or 3-ring binder.
 - c) Animal models may be constructed of any modeling material that you choose. Display in a large, decorated (shoe) box. Attach a one page explanation of your model.

MINI: HOW TO MAKE A POSTER

Your poster must be 22" x 28".

You can buy foam boards and plastic sleeves for covering them at the Extension Office. You can also attach a 22" X 28" poster board to the foam board with double-sided tape (this way you can reuse the foam board and sleeve for future poster projects).

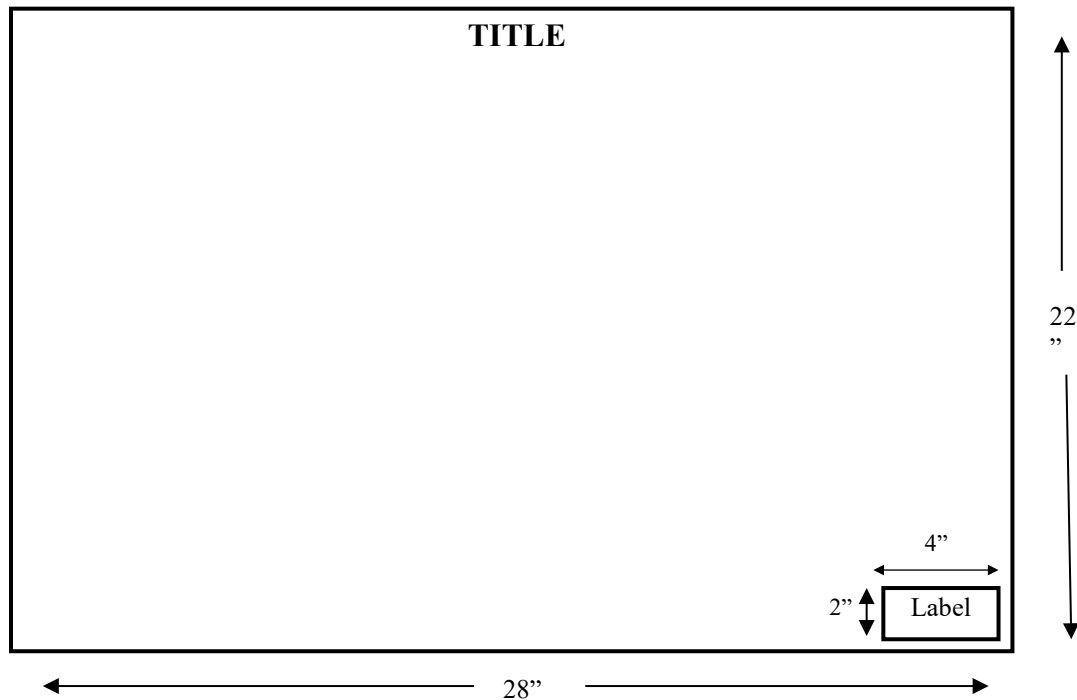
Your poster must be horizontal. See the sample below.

You will need a title at the top of the poster, and a 2' x 4" name label in the lower right corner. Put your project name, your name, grade, and the name of your 4-H club on the label.

When you are done, insert the poster into the plastic sleeve and seal the sleeve.

Your poster is ready for the 4-H Fair!
