SHOOTING SPORTS INSTRUCTOR FALL TRAINING REGISTRATION IS OPEN NOW!

Registration is now open for the fall 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor Training scheduled for September 5-7, 2025, at Ross Camp.

This training is required for individuals who wish to become a 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor or Coordinator or returning to the role after a lapse in Service. Current instructors & coordinators may add to their discipline certifications through this training as well. All 4-H Volunteers must be approved in 4-H Online prior to working

with youth and offering shooting sports opportunities. **New 4-H Volunteers** must also complete the volunteer onboarding process which includes:

- 4-H Volunteer Application (select New Applicant as your volunteer role in 4-H Online)
- Reference check
- State and National Registry Checks
- Completion of required trainings in 4-H Online
- 4-H Volunteer Orientation
- Youth Protection Program Director Training
- Youth Protection Program Staff Training
- Conversation/interview/appointment with the county 4-H Extension Educator

Individual's age 18-20 who are no longer 4-H members

are also invited to register if they are interested in becoming a 4-H Associate Shooting Sports Instructor. Associate 4-H Shooting Sports Instructors must be approved as a 4-H Volunteer and serve under the direct supervision of an approved and certified 4-H Shooting Sports Instructor in the same discipline.

The following disciplines will be offered during the September 5-7 training:

- Archery
- Muzzleloading
- Pistol
- Rifle
- Shotgun
- Coordinator

Registration is through the Indiana Hunter Education Association accessible on <u>their website</u>. Indiana 4-H Shooting Sports resources and information including a link to their IHEA website is available on the <u>Indiana 4-H website</u>.

This is a weekend training and costs \$175 for Coordinators and \$250 for all other disciplines. Reimbursement available to certified 4-H volunteers actively appointed and working with 4-H members in Martin County. Individuals may take only one discipline at a time.

REMOTE WORK PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATE

If you work on a distributed virtual team, work remotely, or desire to work remotely, this educational program is designed to equip workers with the tools and skills needed to be successful in these environments. Specific objectives and outcomes for each module of the course are identified at the beginning of each set of modules. The program consists of nine core modules, delivered in a self-paced, online format, and four interactive workshops.
