Would you like to interact with other 4-H teens from the area, have three fun-filled days camping, and be a positive role model to younger 4-H members? Apply to be a Southern Indiana Camp Counselor! Using the QR Code below you will find a Southern Indiana 4-H Camp Counselor and Junior Camp Director Application for 2026, specific job responsibilities for these positions and a bio sheet. We will once again be camping at Country Lake Christian Retreat, located near Henryville. Camp dates for 2026 will be May 29th-31st. There are thirteen counties camping together from Southern Indiana – Clark, Crawford, Floyd, Harrison, Jackson, Lawrence, Orange, Scott, Washington, Dubois, Martin and Perry.



We will be conducting interviews again! Once you submit your counselor application, you will be provided with a link to sign up for your interview time via Jot Form. Again, this year we will be completing all interviews via Zoom to help you prepare for future interviews, which are more likely to be hosted on a web platform in the current hiring process. Interviews are mandatory to be considered for a Camp Counselor or Junior Camp Director position.

Camp Counselors and the Junior Camp Directors will be chosen from the completed applications, as well as interviews. These applications are due back to the Extension office or uploaded via 4HOnline by February 2, 2026. Applications will be reviewed by the entire Southern Indiana planning team. Competition for Junior Director and Counselor will be tough, so please fill out the applications seriously and completely. We will only be accepting a certain number of counselors this year. Counselors will only be selected if they qualify based on the following criteria:

All Counselors: Application Details, Interview, Leadership Potential

New Counselors: Educator Recommendations

Returning Counselors: Past Performance, Initiative, Appropriate Behavior

IS THIS YOU? DO YOU KNOW FARMERS IN INDIANA, ILLINOIS, OR IOWA?

Interviews are being conducted as part of the *IMPACT²: Social-Ecological Memory in Midwest Agriculture* project, a PhD research study at Purdue University. This work explores how memories and experiences of past extreme weather events (floods, droughts, storms) influence today's farming decisions.

Researchers are looking to connect with farmers across Indiana, Illinois, and Iowa whether involved in grain, livestock, or specialty crops. Of particular interest are multi-generational farm families, though farmers of all backgrounds are welcome. Interviews are in-person, last 45–60 minutes, and participants receive a \$100 honorarium.

2026 4-H ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION UPDATES

Cat, Dog, Ferret, Horse & Pony vaccination forms have been updated and are available from the Extension Office or online at the [Animal ID page](#).

The 4-H Animal Lease Form has no changes for 2026.

As a reminder, the only animals eligible to be formally leased in Indiana 4-H are:

- Dairy females
- Horse & Pony
- Llama & Alpaca

NEW – Indiana State Fair Species Offerings. Two new species offerings will be available at the Indiana State Fair:

- Sheep – Wether Dams: Females bred to produce more market-appearing sheep
- Goats – Myotonics

As a reminder, 4-H Animal Identification Days are required (with the exception of 2020) and are to be held in all counties for the following species:

Cattle

- Beef & Dairy Market Steers
- Beef Market Heifers

- Beef Crossbred Heifers
- Dairy Feeder Calves

Sheep

- Market Lambs (wethers and ewes intended to show as market lambs)
- Wether Dams
- Commercial Ewes needing an RFID tag and/or county tag
 - If animals do not have a scrapies tag, they should attend an ID Day.
 - Please refer to the Indiana 4-H Animal Identification Chart for appropriate language.

Goats

- Market Goat Wethers
- Market Goat Does (Wether Dams)
- Dairy Goat Wethers

Any female goat without a scrapies tag should attend an ID Day. Please refer to the Indiana 4-H Animal Identification Chart for appropriate language.

4-H ANIMAL TAG DISTRIBUTION

Tagging Day in Martin County: Friday, May 1st 6:00 pm – 7:30 pm

All 4-Hers must be fully enrolled in 4-H prior to animal tagging.

Tags should NOT be distributed by Extension Offices for species required to attend an Animal ID Day. Swine are the only species for which tags may be distributed directly through Extension Offices. Swine tags in Martin County will be available 8:30 am to 3:30 am Monday, April 20 to Friday, April 24th and then again on May 1st at the Martin County Animal Tagging Day, 6 pm – 7:30 pm.

If a youth or family is unable to attend the Animal Tag ID Day, we will work with families to ensure proper oversight of tag administration by the Extension Educator and/or appointed 4-H Volunteer who must administer. If you need this, request this accommodation no later than Friday, April 24th.
