



## Virtual 4-H Fair Exhibit Tips – Virtual Entry Required

While it is understood pictures and videos cannot fully replace live exhibits the virtual fair environment is intended to allow a judge to see and learn about the skills a 4-H member has developed throughout this past year resulting from their 4-H experiences. Refer to the Indiana 4-H Youth Development web site [project page](#) for a list of 4-H projects supported by the state 4-H office. In addition to these tips, families can see a summary of files to be uploaded in FairEntry and should follow the link to each project’s page for exhibit requirements. Project	Exhibit	Suggestions
Beef	Photo of Front View Photo of Side View Photo of Rear View  AND Video (1-3 minutes)	<p>Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photos in a well-lit area located outside. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. Make sure animal is not standing in tall grass or deep shavings etc. Photos should not be altered or edited!!! 4-H member should be in at least one image of the animal, and should also be dressed appropriately for the show ring.</p> <p>Video should show youth showing the animal, the purpose of the content is for the youth to share the message of what they have learned about their project and the industry represented including setting animal up. Take the time to set up at least twice showing both sides of animal.</p>
Cat	Full Image of Cat Full Image of Cat’s Face  AND Video (1-3 minutes) of youth presenting the animal	<p>Take the photo in a well-lit area. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. 4-H Member should be present in a photo.</p> <p>Video should show youth showing the animal. Purpose of the content is for the youth to share the message of what they have learned about their project. Highlight features of your cat that a judge might inspect in a live show. Please include: stroke your cat along its back front to rear and interact with a toy. You may also include a cat trick, if you wish.</p>
Creative Writing	Upload document for each entry	Up to 3 entries, each from different category according to rules. Using PDF, Word, Power Point, or Excel format. Due June 26.
Dairy	Image of Front View Image of Side View Image of Rear View  AND Image, video (2-3 minutes), or PowerPoint	<p>Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photos in a well-lit area located outside. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. Make sure animal is not standing in tall grass or deep shavings etc. Photos should not be altered or edited!!! 4-H member should be in at least one image of the animal, and should also be dressed appropriately for the show ring.</p>

	presentation (5 slides or less) of youth setting animal up	Video should show youth showing the animal, the purpose of the content is for the youth to share the message of what they have learned about their project and the industry represented including setting animal up. Take the time to set up at least twice showing both sides of animal.
Dairy Goat	Image of Front View Image of Side View Image of Rear View  AND  Video (2-3 minutes) of youth setting animal up	Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photos in a well-lit area located outside. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. Make sure animal is not standing in tall grass or deep shavings etc. Photos should not be altered or edited!!! 4-H member should be in at least one image of the animal, and should also be dressed appropriately for the show ring.  Video should show youth showing the animal, the purpose of the content is for the youth to share the message of what they have learned about their project and the industry represented including setting animal up. Take the time to set up at least twice showing both sides of animal.
Demonstration	Video	Create a video according to exhibit requirements and upload it to YouTube or another video hosting site. Recording on a phone or similar device will work. Make sure the recording area is well-lit with minimal background noises. Be sure to dress as if you were presenting live in front of the judge and audience. The recording settings should be set to only visible with a link. You will provide that link when submitting entry.
Dog	Video approximately 3 minutes in length.  AND  Full image of dog. 4-H member in photo.	Take footage in a well-lit area. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. 4-H Member should be present in photo/video. Video should include the heel pattern, figure 8 and recall. You should do the appropriate version of each exercise for your class.
Informative 4-H Presentation	Video	Create a video according to exhibit requirements and upload it to YouTube or another video hosting site. Recording on a phone or similar device will work. Make sure the recording area is well-lit with minimal background noises. Be sure to dress as if you were presenting live in front of the judge and audience. The recording settings should be set to only visible with a link. You will provide that link when submitting entry.
Interactive Demonstration	Video	Create a video according to exhibit requirements and upload it to YouTube or another video hosting site. Recording on a phone or similar device will work. Make sure the recording area is well-lit with minimal background noises. Be sure to dress as if you were presenting live in front of the judge and audience. The recording settings should be set to only visible with a link. You will provide that link when submitting entry.

Meat Goat	<p>Image of Front View Image of Side View Image of Rear View</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Video (1-3 minutes) of youth setting animal up</p>	<p>Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode) . Take photos in a well-lit area located outside. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. Make sure animal is not standing in tall grass or deep shavings etc. Photos should not be altered or edited!!! 4-H member should be in at least one image of the animal, and should also be dressed appropriately for the show ring.</p> <p>Video should show youth showing the animal, the purpose of the content is for the youth to share the message of what they have learned about their project and the industry represented including setting animal up. Take the time to set up at least twice showing both sides of animal.</p>
Poultry	<p>Full Image of Bird</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Video (1-3 minutes) of youth setting animal up</p>	<p>Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photos in a well-lit area. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. Make sure animal is not standing in tall grass or deep shavings etc. Photos should not be altered or edited!!! 4-H member should be in the photo with the animal, and should also be dressed appropriately for the show.</p> <p>Video should show youth showing the animal. Purpose of the content is for the youth to share the message of what they have learned about their project and the industry represented. Please include: holding your bird and stretching out its wings. If you have a cage, show how to properly remove bird from cage.</p>
Professional Persuasive Presentation	Video	<p>Create a video according to exhibit requirements and upload it to YouTube or another video hosting site. Recording on a phone or similar device will work. Make sure the recording area is well-lit with minimal background noises. Be sure to dress as if you were presenting live in front of the judge and audience. The recording settings should be set to only visible with a link. You will provide that link when submitting entry. The entire handout packet is to be included in a single electronic file using PDF, Word, Power Point, or Excel format as a second file upload.</p>
Public Speaking	Video	<p>Create a video according to exhibit requirements and upload it to YouTube or another video hosting site. Recording on a phone or similar device will work. Make sure the recording area is well-lit with minimal background noises. Be sure to dress as if you were presenting live in front of the judge and audience. The recording settings should be set to only visible with a link. You will provide that link when submitting entry.</p>
Pygmy Goat	<p>Image of Front View Image of Side View Image of Rear View</p> <p>AND</p>	<p>Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photos in a well-lit area located outside. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. Make sure animal is not standing in tall grass or deep shavings etc. Photos should not be altered or edited!!! 4-H</p>

	Video (1-3 minutes) of youth setting animal up	<p>member should be in at least one image of the animal, and should also be dressed appropriately for the show ring.</p> <p>Video should show youth showing the animal, the purpose of the content is for the youth to share the message of what they have learned about their project and the industry represented including setting animal up. Take the time to set up at least twice showing both sides of animal.</p>
Rabbit	<p>Image of Side View of Rabbit in Pose Image of Rear View Image of Top View</p> <p>AND</p> <p>1-3-minute video</p>	<p>Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photos in a well-lit area. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. Make sure animal is not standing in tall grass or deep shavings etc. Photos should not be altered or edited!!! 4-H member should be in at least one image of the animal, and should also be dressed appropriately for the show table.</p> <p>Please include in your video the proper way to hold your rabbit, the proper way to pose your animal, stroke the fur from front to back, and turn the animal over. Additionally, the judge would like to hear from you the characteristics of your breed, breed requirements, and what you do for basic care.</p>
Rabbit Ambassador	Completion of Exam	Complete coordinated exam via Qualtrics under the direction of local Purdue Extension Office.
Sheep	<p>Image of Front View Image of Side View Image of Rear View</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Video (1-3 minutes) of youth setting animal up</p>	<p>Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photos in a well-lit area located outside. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as possible. Make sure animal is not standing in tall grass or deep shavings etc. Photos should not be altered or edited!!! 4-H member should be in at least one image of the animal, and should also be dressed appropriately for the show table.</p> <p>Video should show youth showing the animal, the purpose of the content is for the youth to share the message of what they have learned about their project and the industry represented including setting animal up. Take the time to set up at least twice showing both sides of animal.</p>
Small Animal	<p>Full image of animal in cage or tank. Full image of animal out of cage, if possible.</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Video (1-3 minutes) of youth with their animal</p>	<p>Present animal as you would for the show. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photo in a well lit area. Take one photo of your animal in its enclosure, cage, or tank. If possible take another of the animal out of the enclosure.</p> <p>Video should show youth properly handling and interacting with animal. Please share how you care for your animal and any important facts about the animal.</p>
Swine	<p>Image of Front View Image of Side View Image of Rear View</p>	Present animal as you would for the show ring. Photos should be taken horizontally (landscape mode). Take photos in a well-lit area located outside. Try to reduce as many shadows and glares as

<p>Table Presentation</p>	<p>1-3 minute video uploaded to YouTube or another easily accessed sharing platform AND enter items from presentation</p>	<p>In your video, assume the person viewing (the judge) is your guest. Greet them as you would in person. Tell your guest about your idea and why you chose your theme. Describe your ingredients and the preparation required for your menu items. You will also bring an entry to project drop off at the Exhibit Hall. Bring one food item from your menu and a copy of the recipe for this item. Bring a copy of your menu. <b>MAKE SURE TO INCLUDE THE LINK TO YOUR VIDEO ON YOUR RECIPE CARD.</b></p>
