FASHION REVUE

Fashion Revue is a learning experience in dressing and grooming for the "total" look, to project a smile, enthusiasm and poise, and help build self-confidence. All sewing and consumer clothing participants can participate in this Fashion Revue which is a public presentation of their project's outfits.

Superintendent:

State Fair Entries: Six (6) State Fair participants 8-12 grade (maximum of 2 per category)

RULES

- 1. Refer to the Parke County 4-H Policies and Entry & Exhibit Requirements.
- 2. Private judging will be held prior to the fair. Construction judging will be on the same date as private judging. The Public Fashion Revue will be in the Large Show Pavilion.
- 3. All sewing members must participate in the Private Fashion Revue to be eligible to participate in the Public Fashion Revue.
- 4. Everyone who participates in the Public Fashion Revue will receive a ribbon. Entrants are asked to model each entry in the Public Fashion Revue that was entered in the Private Fashion Revue.
- 5. Garments modeled must have been made by participants since the previous County Fair 4-H exhibit.
- 6. 4-H Fashion Revue classifications: Handcrafted garments should be modeled in the appropriate class.

ELIGIBILITY

State Fair

- 1. State Fair competition is open to 4-H members who are in the 8th grade in January of the current year and remain eligible as long as he or she has not passed his or her 19th birthday on the first day of the current year are eligible for State Fair competition.
- 2. Garments modeled must have been made by participant since the previous year's 4-H exhibit.
- 3. An entrant may enter in only one (1) State Fair 4-H Fashion Revue classification.
- 4. Costumes to be worn in the State Fair 4-H Fashion Revue cannot be exhibited in the State Fair 4-H Sewing exhibit.

Definition of an outfit:

An outfit is a garment or garments which when put together make a complete look - such as a one or two piece dress, or a one or two piece pant suit, or a three piece combination, such as pants, vest, and blouse or shirt.

Junior Division

Level A: Grade 3

Elastic waist shorts, pants OR skirt with fold over casting; no pockets

Level A: Grade 4

Shorts, pants OR skirt with partial or full sewn on waistband, or waistline facing OR simple shirt or top OR BBQ Apron.

Level B: Grade 5

Simple shirt with sleeves OR sundress OR jumper OR simple 2 piece pajamas.

Level B: Grade 6

Two garments which can be worn together.

Level C: Grade 7

School or sports outfit. Can be one or more pieces.

Senior Division:

Grades 8 thru 12

Dress-Up Wear: This is suitable for special, church, or social occasions which are not considered formal. It
may be an outfit of one or more pieces with or without its own costume coat or jacket (lined or unlined). This
is not an outfit which would be worn to school, weekend, casual, or informal activities.

- **Formal Wear:** This outfit may be one (1) or more pieces suitable for any formal occasion such as proms, weddings, and formal evening functions.
- **Free Choice:** A complete outfit comprised of garments which do not fit in the other classifications. The items are to make a complete outfit. Examples include: tennis wear, swim wear or athletic sportswear; lounge wear; riding habits; historic, dance, theatrical, or international costumes, capes; and unlined coats.
- Informal or Casual Wear: A complete outfit of one (1) or two (2) pieces suitable for school, weekend, casual or informal activities.
- **Separates:** Consists of three garments which must be worn as a coordinated complete outfit. Each piece should be versatile enough to be worn with other garments in your wardrobe.
- Suit or coat: The suit consists of two pieces including a skirt or pants and its own lined jacket. It is not a dress with jacket as in "dress up wear." The coat is a separate lined coat for your wardrobe. It will be judged separately as a coat with its own accessories.

Fashion Revue – Consumer Clothing

Level 1: Grades 3 thru 5

Exhibit an item of clothing which you helped purchase and you'll wear with other clothes in your wardrobe. Examples might be slacks, blouse, jeans, sweater, or sweatshirt. Choose an accessory to go with your purchase. Examples might be shoes, sweatband, belt, jewelry, or socks.

Level 2: Grade 6 thru 8

Exhibit a casual or school outfit you have purchased and accessorized or select from items you already own.

Level 3: Grade 9 thru 12

Exhibit an outfit you have purchased and accessorized or select from items you already own.
