Animal Information

Animal ID tagging day

When: **April 20, 2024** Time: 8AM-10AM

Where: Posey County Fairgrounds Who: Beef, Sheep, Goat Exhibitors

What:

- All beef, dairy, meat goat, sheep and swine exhibitors are required to correctly enter animal tag
 ID's into 4-H Online. You will not be allowed to enter 0's into the tag entry on 4-H Online.
- Due to biosecurity concerns, swine exhibitors are required to request tags on: https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAlpQLSdSyF141PKoSUsCzqOUwqhkW5a-bYAr9K5nzNhYAhavEJxRmw/viewform?usp=sf_link
- It will be the 4-H'ers responsibility to tag their hogs. If you need taggers or assistance, please
 reach out to the Extension Office. 4-H'ers can also come to the tagging day on April 20 to
 receive help with entering tags into 4-H Online. Do not bring your hogs to the fairgrounds for
 tagging on this day.
- The tagging day on April 20 will be where beef, sheep and meat goat exhibitors will have their animals tagged. There will be laptops and tablets available as well as assistance from the Extension Office on entering tags into 4-H Online.
- Tagging day is an educational opportunity for 4-H'ers. It will provide an opportunity for youth to
 ask questions to livestock superintendents about the care of their animals as well as provide
 assistance to families on 4-H Online.

Premise ID

Registering your premises is done online, at no charge, and takes only about 5 minutes. Visit the Indiana State Board of Animal Health's (BOAH) website: www.in.gov/boah and click on "Premises Registration".

BOAH staff will issue a premise identification number (also known as a "premID") within three to five business days after the online form is submitted. If registering by mail with a paper form, allow ten business days for a premID to be issued.

Do you need to verify your premises identification number? Contact BOAH at: 317-544-2400 or email animalhealth@boah.in.gov. Be sure to note the name and premises' physical address listed on the registration.

All Indiana premises associated with the purchase, sale and/or exhibition of cattle, swine, sheep, goats and farmed cervids must be registered by state law. Registration allows BOAH to be more effective tracing animal movements in a major animal health emergency investigation.

4-H Online Animal ID Family Sharing

Please note that you are only allowed to list siblings' animals on your 4-H Online profile. You cannot list secondary family animals on your 4-H Online. This means you cannot list cousins' animals on your profile. If you have any questions, please contact the Extension Office 812-838-1331.

Official ID

An Official ID tag is imprinted with an "US shield" -

Official ID tags include but not limited to Scrapie Tag, Flock ID, visual 840 Tags &/or 840 RFID Tags.

Official ID tags are permanent & tamper resistant.

It is a FELONY to remove an Official Identification!

Animal ID Deadline

All animal identification is to be submitted on 4-H Online by May 15. Animals not enrolled by this deadline cannot be exhibited at the county or state fair.

Mandatory for Most Animal Exhibitors:

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care (IQLC)

To exhibit beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry and rabbits, 4-H members must be certified through a quality livestock care program. This is an important educational opportunity for 4-H livestock members. Making this an exhibition requirement is how we are ensuring that 4-H members learn about quality assurance, but it really has nothing to do with animal exhibition. The reason we are requiring a quality livestock care program is for youth to learn best management practices with their animals.

Deadline to complete Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training or YQCA (online) is July 1.

In-person IQLC training dates:

- March 21
- April 10
- May 13

Trainings will be at the PCCEC on the Fairgrounds and start at 6PM.

Goat Project Update

2024 Indiana 4-H Animal Identification

The following table lists the different animal species and the respective form of identification that is required for a 4-H member to be eligible to show in the 4-H livestock shows at the 2024 Indiana State Fair. The animal ID information must be entered in the Indiana 4-H Online enrollment system by the respective deadlines. Missing, incomplete or incorrect animal ID information could result in state fair ineligibility for that particular animal.


