Once the individual applying to be an Approved Groomer has submitted all of their information, an email will be sent to you from the State 4-H Office. **Please submit a copy of that email to the Extension Office so we can compile a list of Approved Groomers.**

If you will be receiving grooming assistance from a 4-Her in another county, the following information needs to be given to Sam before **JUNE 1st**: First and last name of the individual and the county where they participate in 4-H. After receiving this information, we will contact the Extension Office in the corresponding county to verify the information.

**Animal Online Enrollment for 2022
 Deadline May 15, 2022**



Livestock Weigh-in and Tagging Dates

Beef & Dairy - February 26, 9-11 AM, Fairgrounds

Goat & Sheep - April 29, 6-8 PM, Fairgrounds

Starter Calves - May 7, 8-10 AM, Fairgrounds

Poultry and Rabbit - June 11, 9-11 AM, Fairgrounds

Animals must be enrolled online at v2.4honline.com

This online enrollment process includes: Horse/Pony, Goats, Sheep, Rabbits, Swine, Beef, and Dairy. Poultry will use the paper enrollment form.

Remember, all species that require DNA hair samples to exhibit at the State Fair (Beef cattle, Dairy cattle, Swine, Sheep, & Goats) must be enrolled and DNA hair samples submitted by May 15. DNA envelopes can be picked up at the Extension Office.

If you are enrolled in livestock for the 2022 Pulaski County 4-H & Community Fair, you **MUST complete a YQCA training before June 1st**. The training can also be completed online for a \$12 fee.

All Pulaski County livestock projects will adapt the Indiana State Fair Grooming Assistance Rule. Grooming Assistance forms can be found online. If you are receiving assistance from another 4-Her: first name, last name, and county of 4-H participation must be turned in no later than **June 1st!**

For weigh-ins, 4-H members will utilize a "worksheet" created by the State 4-H office. These are available at the Extension Office and online. These worksheets have replaced the carbon copies.

All **Dairy heifers & Registered heifers** must have a RFID tag by May 15th.

All Livestock Exhibitors must register between May 1st—June 1st online at <http://pulaskicountyin.fairentry.com>. This process declares what animals they are exhibiting at the Pulaski County Fair only.

All Poultry members should be reviewing the current poultry rules. Ducks, turkey, pullets, exhibition chickens classes should be acquired early to concentrate on growth and development for fair time, other classes should be reviewed. Also, make sure to get your poultry enrollment form with the poultry listed that are coming to the fair into the Extension Office by May 15th.

Rabbit Members: Interested in showing a Rabbit Meat Pen or a Single Fryer? First year through advanced Rabbit members are eligible to exhibit in each of these classes. Meat Pens and Single Fryers must be raised by the 4-H rabbit member. Each rabbit must weigh between 3½ and 5½lbs, maximum age is 10 weeks. Six Class Breeds only. The chart below will guide you when to breed your Does for the 2022 Pulaski Co. 4-H & Community Fair. Meat Pen and Single Fryer maximum age is 10 weeks (70 days) old. For more information regarding the rabbit project, check the 2022 Pulaski County Rabbit Rules.
