All 4-H members enrolled in livestock projects (beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry, including game birds, waterfowl, and pigeons, and rabbits) are required to complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) annual training to exhibit animals. This applies to all 4-Hers that will have livestock exhibited at the county fair and at the Indiana State Fair.

Youth may complete the training online at yqcaprogram.org for \$12 or participate in an in-person training at the Sullivan Co. Fairgrounds for \$3. Youth must be registered and paid for in advance of the trainings. Register at yqcaprogram.org, or call the office for assistance.

Sullivan County Extension Homemakers Scholarship

Any Sullivan County high school senior entering a school of higher education is eligible to apply for the \$300 Sullivan County Extension Homemakers Scholarship. Applicant must be a resident of Sullivan County, Indiana.

Please submit an essay of 300-500 words. Essay must be typed, double spaced on one side of page only. The content of essay is "Discuss the importance of vocational education (family and consumer sciences and agriculture) in high school curriculum."

Include name, address, telephone number and high school name on the back of each page. Judges will not know whose essay they are reading.

Entries must be received no later than 4 p.m. on Friday, April 29, 2022. Mail or deliver to: Purdue Extension Sullivan County, 1361 E Co Rd 75 N, Sullivan, IN 47882. Do not email.

Money will be paid directly to the school or college, not to the student.

Purdue Fast Start Program

Hey High School students! Purdue University's new "Fast Start" program, created by Purdue in partnership with the philanthropic online learning program Modern States, is designed to help Indiana high school students earn access to up to a year of college credit through free online courses and the corresponding College Level Examination Program (CLEP) exams. Students receive assured admission into Purdue if they complete five courses, pass the corresponding CLEP exams and meet the University's standard admissions requirements.

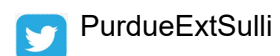
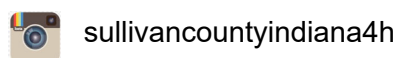
Fast Start will allow Hoosier students to take online courses and CLEP exams at no cost. Passing five CLEP exams — the equivalent of one semester — can save students and their parents the cost of an entire semester, and almost \$11,000.

The program officially launched in Fall 2020, with inaugural students granted admission for the Fall 2021 semester.

Attention Sheep, Goat, and Cattle 4-H Members:

We wanted to make you aware of one change to the tagging process of animals this year for our county. To align ourselves with other counties across Indiana, county tags for sheep, goats, and cattle will only be sold during tag in days. The animals needing a county tag need to come to the tag in day. We will no longer be allowing cattle, goat, and sheep members to tag their own animals with county 4-H tags purchased from the office. If you cannot make it to a tag in day, please let your superintendent or the Extension office know, and we will work with you to get your animals tagged. Again, county tags will not be able to be picked up from the Extension office by the 4-Her to tag their animals on their own. Brooke (Extension Educator) or your livestock superintendent will need to be present when a county tag is placed in an ear. This is only for cattle, sheep, and goats. All ID requirements have stayed the same, the only change is how you will purchase **county** tags (not RFID tags). Animal ID requirements are on the back of this page.

RFID tags will continue to be sold as normal, as you can also buy RFID tags in stores.

The following table lists the different animal species and the respective form of identification that is required for a 4-H member to be eligible to show in the 4-H livestock shows at the 2022 Indiana State Fair and the Sullivan County Fair. The animal ID information must be entered in the Indiana 4-H Online enrollment system by May 16. Missing, incomplete or incorrect animal ID information could result in ineligibility to show for that particular animal.

Comparing 4-H Online & Fair Entry

We are now going into our 8th year of 4HOnline and the Fair Entry systems. It's easy to be confused by the two systems and we are hoping this explanation helps. As always, office staff is only a phone call away at 812-268-4332 or email sullivances@purdue.edu.

Below is a chart that shows you the purpose of 4-H Online and Fair Entry. Save this page and check off the following tasks as you complete them.

IN 4-H ONLINE, YOU WILL:

- Enroll in 4-H
- Enroll in projects you intend to complete
- Identify the following species by May 15; Beef, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Sheep, Swine, Horse & Pony (requirements vary by species)
- May 15 is the deadline to add or drop a project. This is for ALL projects.

IN FAIR ENTRY, YOU WILL:

- Enter all of your project(s) into the correct levels, divisions, or classes that you will be exhibiting at the fair. (non-animal and animal)
- This system will be used for **ALL projects** with the exception of Mini members. Mini 4-Hers do not complete anything in Fair Entry.
- All livestock must be entered into the correct classes at this time (see dates below).

- Currently open for enrollment.
- May 15: Beef, Dairy Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Swine, Horse & Pony must be identified in 4-H Online (v2.4honline.com). 4-H Online will close at midnight!

- May 16-June 24: All projects, non-animals and animals, enter into Fair Entry

Animals vaccination reminders

Dogs must be vaccinated before they attend workshops. (Schedule coming soon.)

Cats must be vaccinated at least 2 weeks before they show at the county fair.

Horses, including Mini 4-H horses, are to be up to date on vaccinations before coming to workshops, and shown at the fair.

Adult 4-H Volunteers in-person training option

Online volunteer training must be completed ASAP. Please set aside an hour to complete this. Do so individually online through your v2.4honline.com profile. Instructions were mailed and emailed, so please check those out or call the Extension office for assistance.

The in-person training is the same training, but convenient for those with Internet challenges or those who'd rather check this off their list in person.
