Fairgrounds Set Up

Saturday, June 8th starting at 9 am we will need a large number of 4-H members & volunteers to assist with fairgrounds set up! Lunch will be provided for all. Be sure to wear comfortable shoes and old clothes.
4-H members who help at fairgrounds set up and check in with Morgan Lutz will receive a free bracelet for the carnival bracelet night – must work a minimum of 2+ hours to be eligible to receive this from the Vermillion County Fair Board.

My Record of 4-H Achievement

This is the official record of your participation of projects & 4-H activities within the 4-H program. Each year you will fill out this sheet for the current year. It is important that you fill it out because it helps you qualify for the National Achievement Awards, scholarships, and other awards throughout your 4-H career. During the fair, you may leave it in the box labeled "My Record of 4-H Achievement" located in the 4-H Community Building hallway. Or, if you would like to include your 2024 fair awards & recognition, turn it in to the Extension Office or email it to Morgan at mwillhit@purdue.edu by July 1st.



Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care

To exhibit Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Swine, Sheep, Meat Goats, Dairy Goats, Poultry, and Rabbits, 4-H members must be certified through the Indian 4-H Quality Livestock Care training OR the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals Program (YQCA). If you missed one of our three in person QLC Trainings, it is your responsibility to complete the online YQCA training. You will need to register at www.yqcaprogram.org and turn in a copy of the certificate to the Extension Office. This must be done in order for the 4-Her to show livestock at county and state fair.



Record Sheets

The Vermillion County General Record Sheet is a summary of what you have learned this year. You will need to fill it out, and take it to your 4-H Club Leader or any Purdue Extension staff to get their signature. You will take this with you as you check in each of your projects to get the judges signature as well. Once it is all filled in, then you will keep it in your green folder for your records.

The Vermillion County Livestock Record sheet is a summary of what you have learned throughout raising your livestock for the current year. It is also a record summary of your expenses. Once this is filled out, you will need to turn it in to your livestock superintendent before the respected show. These are graded by each superintendent for a special award, so be sure to take your time and write neatly. These will be returned at our awards program in August or you may pick them up at project check out Friday evening or Saturday morning.

All 4-Hers must enter through the main doors of the 4-H Community Building and stop at the check in table to scan the barcode on your exhibit tag BEFORE going to the judges.

Livestock Exhibitors

Please look at the following updates for the 2024 fair regarding livestock check in & weigh in:

- Llama & Alpaca check in will be Sunday, June 16 from 3 pm 4 pm. Please use the EAST entrance gate and proceed to the horse barn. Morgan Lutz will be present in the barn for the check in process.
 - Horse & Pony check in will be Sunday, June 16 from 5 pm 8 pm. Please use the EAST entrance gate and proceed to the horse barn. Isabelle Holtkamp will be present in the barn for the check in process.
 - ALL other livestock must enter through the WEST gate of the fairgrounds. Swine, Sheep, Cattle, and Goats will be checked in on the trailer this year. Morgan Lutz & Livestock Superintendents will be present at the pavilion near the carnival lot. ALL trailers must stop there so we can check you in and also do a health check on your animals. Once you are checked in, you will proceed to the barns to unload and weigh in. Please get weighed in as soon as you are done unloading.
 - If possible, if your last name starts with A-L, you will come between 5 pm 6:30 pm and if your last name starts with M-Z, you will come between 6:30 pm 8 pm. Please be courteous of others and unload as quick as you can.
- Rabbits & Poultry will be checked in at their respective barn by the superintendents & Heather Medina.
- Swine Exhibitors come to check in dressed in show clothes, so we can take your auction photo ahead of time!



Welcome to the Dark Side: Mothing in Indiana – July 17th

Often unseen, moths are viewed as the drab-dingy-looking cousins of butterflies. With over 2,500 species recorded in the state, nothing could be further from the truth! To learn more about Indiana's moths, Purdue Extension is hosting Indiana moth-er, Jeanette Jaskula, as she presents "Welcome to the Dark Side: Mothing in Indiana" to show the stunning diversity of moths, their importance in terrestrial ecosystems, and how we can sustain and support them in our backyards with native plants. **This program will be at the Clinton Public Library on July 17**th **at 2:00 pm.** In addition, Purdue Extension will be providing 10 different species of native plants (while supplies last) that support native pollinator populations for participants to plant in their home landscapes.

Jeanette has a master's degree in environmental science from the University of Wisconsin - Green Bay. She has studied a variety of taxa from salamanders to birds to bats. For the past several years, moths have been her passion. As president of Friends of the Sands, Jeanette has developed public mothing programs at The Nature Conservancy's Kankakee Sands prairie restoration in Newton County. She has photographed over 1,300 species of moths in Indiana. Jeanette enjoys sharing her enthusiasm for these rather unknown and underappreciated creatures of the night.

Data from the 2022 Census of Agriculture is now available. All Census of Agriculture data can also be accessed using NASS's searchable database, https://quickstats.nass.usda.gov

The Census of Agriculture is a complete count of U.S. farms and ranches and the people who operate them. Even small plots of land - whether rural or urban - count if \$1,000 or more of such products were raised and sold, or normally would have been sold, during the census year. The Census of Agriculture, taken only once every five years, looks at land use and ownership, operator characteristics, production practices, income and expenditures. For America's farmers and ranchers, the Census of Agriculture is their voice, their future, and their opportunity.
