Welcome to the Dark Side: Mothing in Indiana – July 17th

Often unseen, moths are viewed as the drab-dingy-looking cousins of butterflies. With over 2,500 species recorded in the state, nothing could be further from the truth! To learn more about Indiana’s moths, Purdue Extension is hosting Indiana moth-er, Jeanette Jaskula, as she presents “Welcome to the Dark Side: Mothing in Indiana” to show the stunning diversity of moths, their importance in terrestrial ecosystems, and how we can sustain and support them in our backyards with native plants. **This program will be at the Clinton Public Library on July 17th at 2:00 pm.** In addition, Purdue Extension will be providing 10 different species of native plants (while supplies last) that support native insect populations for participants to plant in their home landscapes.

The Parke-Vermillion Master Gardener Association will host Monarch butterfly hobbyist and Purdue Extension Master Gardener, Brenda Alabaugh on Tuesday, July 23rd at 5:30 pm at the Parke County Extension Office (1472 N US Highway 41, Rockville, IN). Brenda will share her passion about raising Monarch butterflies from eggs to butterflies then releasing them to increase their population. Her experience has taught her many things and given her an appreciation of the delicate life cycle of the Monarch. She will discuss her experiences and how to aid Monarch survival by planting nectar and host plants in your home landscape. Anyone under 18 must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. Moth Night Out at Atherton Island Natural Area – July 27th

In celebration of National Moth Week, Ouabache Land Conservancy is offering a night out on the prairie at Atherton Island Natural Area in southwestern Parke County on July 27th. This is for all nature enthusiasts that would like to learn about prairie, creatures of the night, “foxfire”, and skygazing.

An optional easy walk around the prairie will start at 8:30 pm to discover what flowers are blooming for our native pollinators. After dark (about 9:30 pm) we’ll attract and identify many species of moths, beetles, ant lions, and other insects up-close on a large white sheet. Participants will see the many different moth patterns, colors, and behaviors, as well as learn about the essential role of moths as pollinators. Information about what native plants to plant for moths and other pollinators will be shared, as well as, information about how to contribute to community science by reporting moth/butterfly sightings through the Great American Indiana Nature Lepidoptera Project (GAINLP).

We also hope to capture images of flying squirrels, white-footed mice, and other creatures attracted to an LED red light and sunflower feeder set up in the nearby woods. In addition, we’ll be monitoring bat activity with the aid of a bat

detector. Lastly, we'll also see the fascinating fungi of Atherton Island known as "foxfire" that begin to glow after dark and have a telescope available to do some skygazing by the nearby campfire.

In summary, Moth Night Out is a free family-friendly event (no pre-registration required) and will be held at Atherton Island Natural Area, with parking available at 6540 W CR 800 S, Rosedale, IN (near Lyford, about 0.7 miles east of Hwy 41). Please carpool as much as possible as parking is limited and overflow parking will likely be used. The optional prairie walk will start at 8:30 pm, with nocturnal activities from 9:30 pm to 11:00 pm. Water and a handicapped-accessible porta-potty will be provided. Please bring your own tick/mosquito repellent as needed.

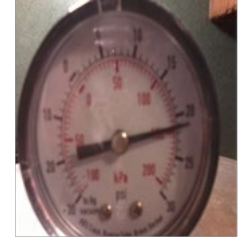

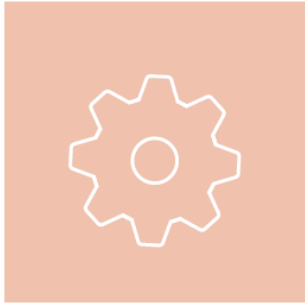
