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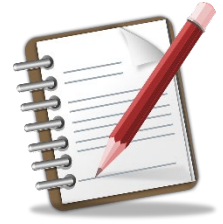

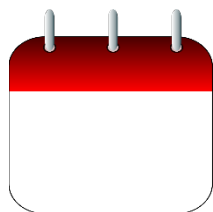

The **Money Smart for Older Adults** program raises awareness among older adults and their caregivers on how to prevent fraud, scams, and other elder financial exploitation. The program encourages advanced planning and informed financial decision-making. Money Smart for Older Adults was developed jointly by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB).

Empower Me to Be Clutter Free is a 3-part series that provides decluttering strategies, controlling paper clutter, and maintaining order; while considering emotional barriers that often prevent letting go of things.

Strategies for Estate Planning Including Your Digital Assets provides information about the estate planning process, advance directives, organizing important documents, and planning for the transfer of digital assets. Please note the time and location change for this program!

DINING WITH DIABETES is returning this spring! Purdue Extension Vermillion County is once again partnering with the Vermillion County Health Department to offer this program for adults with type 2 diabetes, or who are at risk of type 2 diabetes, and their family members, caregivers, and support persons. The program will help you learn the skills needed to promote good health. Dining with Diabetes consists of four sessions and a follow-up, and is taught by

trained and caring educators.

The program includes:

- planning meals and snacks with delicious and healthy recipes
- cooking demonstrations and food sampling
- motivation and support — connect with others who are living with diabetes
- ideas for being more active
- an understanding of how diabetes affects your overall health

2025 SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Senior Year Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in their senior year of high school

Club Scholarship

Available to 4-H members entering Purdue University majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences

Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship

Available to a 4-H member majoring in horticulture or landscape architecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

Accomplishment Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

Categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

Eligibility: Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

Awards: A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in each of these categories: Premier Achievement; Premier Citizenship; and Premier Leadership.

Indiana Hort Conference & Expo – January 14 & 15



The annual Indiana Horticultural Conference and Expo (IHC) will take place Jan. 14-15 at the Hendricks County Fairgrounds. Vegetable and fruit growers are invited to join Purdue Agriculture specialists for two days of educational sessions and networking with fellow Indiana and Midwestern farmers and vendors.

Scheduled educational session topics will cover fruit and vegetable production, food safety, controlled environment agriculture and business marketing. IHC’s annual event will also include a cider-tasting contest and a silent auction to benefit the fruit and vegetable Extension and research fund.

Credits will be available for private pesticide applicators, commercial pesticide applicators and certified crop advisors. Purdue Extension Master Gardener Basic Training Class Applications due February 10

Everyone that wants to learn all about gardening and volunteer to teach others about gardening, are invited to participate in the Parke-Vermillion Master Gardener Basic Training Class starting on Monday, February 24th at the Montezuma Fire Department (551 E. Crawford St.). There will be 14 classes that will meet every Monday through June 2th (except May 26) from 6:00 to 9:00 pm. No previous gardening experience is required. Space is limited and registration is due by February 14th.

Instructors are Purdue Extension experts that teach classes in plant science, fruit and vegetable gardening, weeds & pesticides, herbaceous and woody ornamentals, soils and plant nutrition, lawn care, identification and control of pests, plant diseases, and invasive species. There is a \$145 fee for the training that includes the Purdue Master Gardener Manual plus handouts. Couples may share materials for a reduced fee of \$225.

The Master Gardener Program is one way Purdue Extension puts knowledge to work and helps people grow. First, the Purdue Extension Master Gardener Program helps gardeners grow by providing them with intensive education in horticultural principles. Participants, in turn, share their knowledge and help others grow by providing volunteer leadership and service to their communities in educational gardening activities.
