

DINING WITH DIABETES is returning Spring 2026! Purdue

Extension Vermillion County is once again partnering with the Vermillion County Health Department to offer this program for adults with type 2 diabetes, or who are at risk of type 2 diabetes, and their family members, caregivers, and support persons. The program will help you learn the skills needed to promote good health. Dining with Diabetes consists of four sessions and a follow-up, and is taught by trained and caring educators.

The program includes:

- planning meals and snacks with delicious and healthy recipes
- cooking demonstrations and food sampling
- motivation and support connect with others who are living with diabetes
- ideas for being more active
- an understanding of how diabetes affects your overall health

Advance registration is required.
