PROJECT COMPLETION DEADLINE IS AUGUST 31, 2023

If you did not exhibit your project at the 2023 Fair, you can still complete your project by following the 4-H Handbook guidelines listed below:

The completion of a 4-H project must not be misinterpreted as exhibition of said project at a local, county or state fair. A 4-H member is considered to have completed their project for that year when they have:

- 1. Completed an "official" 4-H Member Enrollment Form prior to the established and published date for enrolling.
- 2. Turned in a completed 4-H project record sheet prior to the established and published date; and
- 3. Had an officially recognized 4-H Leader/Extension Educator verify the existence of the completed project or activity.

Exhibiting in the county and/or state fair is not required for project completion, as it does not necessarily relate directly to content and skills learned in the development of the 4-H project. Project exhibition is encouraged as a continuation of the educational experiences.

You must complete one project to complete the 4-H Year.

NOTE: If you show your completed project to your leader, the leader must notify the Extension Office so that completion can be recorded.

If you have not given that information to the office, please do so ASAP...even if your info has NOT changed, so we can confirm what we have. 

- Keep stories and conversations fun and interesting.
- Children love make-believe stories, especially when they are in the story.
- Use open-ended conversation starters.
