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4-H ENROLLMENT REQUIRED ANNUALLY FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS

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WHO?

All participants - youth and adult volunteers - who intend on participating in 4-H events, activities, competitions, meetings, etc. in the 2024-2025 program year.

Mini 4-H: Kindergarden - 2nd grade 4-H: 3rd - 12th grade

WHAT?

All participants must enroll/re-enroll annually on 4HOnline.

WHEN?

Enrollment deadline is January 15, 2025.

After that date, you can still enroll but all communications from the Extension office will switch over to the 2024-2025 program year database. That means if you miss the deadline, you will not recieve emails or postcards until your enrollment is completed.

WHERE?

V2.4HONLINE.COM

WHY?

4HOnline is the online platform utilized statewide. It stores important emergency contacts, need-to-know medical details, trainings, and other important information. It is also the platform used to register for various 4-H events.



TIPS & FAQS:



If you already have a profile created on 4HOnline, use that instead of creating a new one.

What if I moved counties? Should I create a new account? No - You should keep the same profile you previously created and contact the Extension office in your new county to assist you.





If you are unsure of a club to choose, leave that blank. We will be sharing information on club soon.

Contact the Extension office to assist you in resetting it.














LIVESTOCK AMBASSADOR PROGRAM
