Investing for Retirement

- Why should I start investing for retirement? For the most part, sooner is better. The short-term fluctuations of the stock market tend to have less impact on your return the longer you invest. According to Schwab "Time in the market is more important than timing the market"
 - o Example provided by Schwab: "Alma invests



\$10,000 when she's 31 and lets the money grow for 20 years. Dave invests \$2,000 a year on the same day each year, starting at age 41, for only 10 years. By the time they both reach age 50, Alma has nearly 15% more than Dave even though she invested

half as much. Alma has an ending balance of \$32,071 compared to Dave's balance of \$27,943."

- When can I retire? You can retire whenever you desire to leave the workforce and can afford to do so. Most often people have many restrictions on when they can leave the workforce. Some employers require a certain amount of time (for example 20 years) before employees are eligible for company pension. Another reason people stay in the workforce longer is due to health insurance. Medicare doesn't start until age 65 and Social Security cannot be collected until age 62.
- What are common types of retirement investments? –
 Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRA), Roth IRA,
 401(k), 403(b), Simplified Employee Pension (SEP) Plan,
 Salary Reduction Simplified Employee Pension (SARSEP)
 Plan, Employee Stock Ownership Plan (ESOP) *To learn
 more about these, visit https://www.irs.gov/retirement plans/plan-sponsor/types- of-retirement-plans
- What is the difference between savings and investing? –
 Saving is putting money away to use later. Generally,
 people save money for fixed expenses such as their
 mortgage, and monthly bills, and also for unexpected
 expenses/emergencies. Investing is putting money into
 either a stock or a bond with the hopes that the value will
 increase over time.

- How much money should be invested once I retire? This
 varies from person to person. Ideally, you need to have an
 understanding of how much you'll be spending. You can
 calculate this amount based on your lifestyle or you can
 seek the help of a financial advisor.
- Is investing risky? There are risks associated with investing. Diversifying your portfolio is one way to help manage your risk. Diversification is placing your money in different types of investments. Think of it as NOT putting all of your eggs into one basket. This may mean you are putting money in bonds and stocks.

Recipe: Melon Mania Fruit Salad Source: www.aicr.org

Melon Mania Salad Ingredients:

1 lb. ripe watermelon

½ lb. ripe honeydew melon

½ lb. ripe cantaloupe

4 Tablespoons diced feta cheese

2 Tablespoons finely chopped fresh mint leaves

Juice of 1-2 limes

Optional: salt and pepper to taste

Optional: whole sprigs of mint leaves for garnish

Instructions: (1) Remove the seeds from all of the melons. Then cut them into bite-sized pieces. (2) Put bite-sized melon pieces in a large mixing bowl. Add the feta cheese and chopped mint. (3) Add squeezed lime juice and, if desired, a pinch of salt and pepper to taste. If you are using whole sprigs of mint leaves, place them on top of the salad to garnish. (4) Mix, serve in individual bowls, and then enjoy!

IMPORTANT FAIR ITEMS

In order for your 2024 4-H Fair to be successful, make sure you do the following:

- Complete 4-H Rule Book is online at the Whitley County 4-H Hub at: https://bit.ly/whitleycounty4-Hhub
- Get your 4-H project papers from the Extension Office
- Turn in completed 4-H animal record sheet and animal worksheets to the Extension Office by 7:00 P.M. by Monday, July 1st.
- Check the 4-H Fair Schedule Online on the Whitley County 4-H Hub for times to exhibit your projects/animals.

Notary Public

Do you need a notary public for some of your 4-H paperwork? A notary public is available most of the times at the Extension Office and during the 4-H Fair. Cost is \$5.00 for the first document; \$1.00 for each additional document.

4-H Non-Livestock Project Judging

For 2024 Whitley County 4-H Non-Livestock Project judging will be open to only 4-H youth who are exhibiting a project. This means the 4-H'er can be present and talk with the judge as the judging takes place. This is an excellent educational process for many reasons. It allows the judge to ask the 4-H'er questions, the judge can point out what the 4-H'er has done well and it's easier to show the areas of improvement than to write them.

According to the Whitley County 4-H Rule Book, once the blue, red, and white ribbons have been placed on projects everyone must leave the room/area while the judge selects the champion exhibits. We expect youth to respect the judges and their decisions, and abide by the rules.

Attention Non-Animal Project Exhibitors – PARADE OF CHAMPIONS

All Champions for static projects on exhibit in the 4-H Center will be recognized at the Parade of Champions on Sunday, July 14th at 5:00 p.m. in the American Landmaster Show Barn. This year we will also be awarding Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion honors to non-animal projects. These will be announced at the Parade of Champions. You will need to check your project in the 4-H Center to see if your project is Champion. If your project has a purple Champion rosette, then you will need to report to the Show Barn by 4:45 p.m. to line up.

This information will be linked to a bar code that will be scanned at check-in and will be utilized in other areas, such as judging, placings and results.

Tags are 27/8" wide x 5 ½" tall and the 4-H'er will need to leave this amount of space in the lower right corner of posters blank to accommodate their entry tag.





Gardening with a Disability

If you love gardening, but experience physical challenges due to a disability, there are some things you can do and information you can access that will hopefully allow you to continue your passion.

The first thing to consider is raised beds. Bending over is a challenge for many, with or without a disability. Raised beds can bring the plants up to a more comfortable height, and raised beds can be constructed to allow wheelchair access.

Indiana Agrability/Breaking New Ground Outreach Program at Purdue recently published their summer newsletter. They said to consider things like effective apparel for sun protection, well-fitting gloves, and proper footwear for good traction. Choosing the best time of day to avoid excessive heat can be important, and be sure to stay hydrated. Warming up and stretching can also help reduce the chances of injury, as can focusing on proper ergonomics and techniques.
